

2014 was a very good year for our Association. Your executive has been busy, and we have had some changes in roles with Bob Hadley's successful election to Municipal Council. The executive appointed Joe Kaehler as President and Chuck Noble as Treasurer, retaining his Lake Steward role. His informative report follows. Harry Quart is our new VP, and Grant Ketcheson remains our Secretary. Grant's record keeping is fine, but he's rotten at fetching me coffee or a second beer.

If you're thinking of joining the executive this year, come for a visit. Our executive meetings happen once a month at my house (393 Mile Point Lane). Liquids are offered as a motivator to keep the meeting under 45 minutes. We are happy to say "things get done" efficiently. As this is an election year for our Association you may want to pop in on an executive to see that we do have some fun. If you're considering this offer make sure you let us know. We need new blood and the new ideas that come with it. We would like old blood too, as they have knowledge that comes with experience.

Here's a few things you want to know about. Highway 62 traffic this summer will be limited to a single lane going over the Moira Lake Bridge. The bridge is scheduled for maintenance. We have been in contact with the appropriate parties, and have been assured that boat traffic will not be restricted in any way. The MOE is projecting no adverse environmental impact to the Lake.

At last year's AGM, you spoke and we listened. Here are a few results. Your weed harvester operators were successful in their attempts to remove the debris that lodged into the trestle bridge during last year's high water flow. This was no small task. Congrats to the crews. We have reported the related damage to the Municipality, and we notified the local snowmobile club of the missing supports. As of now they see no long-term negative impact to structural stability. The Eastern Ontario Snowmobile Trail Association has that bridge in its replacement plan as funds and priorities become available.

Past President Don Berry procured additional buoys required for safer navigation of lower lake. As stated

in the past, we mark AREAS that have rocks NOT THE ROCKS THEMSELVES. Please give these buoys a wide berth.

The Association's delegation to the past council was successfully presented. We continue to praise the benefits of the public weed harvester cuts to all who will listen to the facts. Please read the enclosed letter dated October 28, 2014 to understand how the weed harvester benefits ALL residents of this Municipality.

We are moving forward with the 911 Lakeside Identification initiative. Read on to see how you can protect your property and loved ones at a substantial discount.

With a new council comes a new Municipal/MLPOA liaison. Councilor Eric Sandford brings a willingness to progressively work with us. He has demonstrated openness, and is easy to share ideas with.

We have invited the local Kiwanis Club to share ideas for the future of Boat Launch. We are interested in collaborative projects that will benefit the Lake and our Members.

2014 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Minutes

The 2014 Annual General meeting of the Moira Lake Property Owners Association was held on August 9 at the Madoc Public Library with 25 members in attendance.

In the absence of President Bob Hadley, Treasurer Joe Kaehler conducted the meeting. He read the President's message and voiced the apologies of the President for not being able to attend.

Minutes of the last AGM were adopted as circulated.

Financial report was given by Joe Kaehler, with a current balance of \$6,250.36. In addition, there is a \$5,000 GIC at TD Canada Trust, maturing in 2015.

The 2014-15 budget was presented in the newsletter and was discussed and approved by a motion from Corrine Engelman and Bruce McNevin. A donation to the 2015 Bass Tournament was discussed, and the executive were authorized to spend up to \$200.00 on a motion from Jim Bakker and Darryl Kramp.

Chuck Noble, Lake Steward, gave his report and noted that the first weed harvester cut is done, with 38 private locations as well as the public areas. The second cut is scheduled to begin on August 11th. All buoys were placed, somewhat later than other years due to very high water levels. There was a suggestion for more buoys. Don Berry informed the meeting that he has extra buoys at his residence.

A member raised concerns about leaning and dislodged posts on the rail-trail bridge. Chuck Noble will check on that next week. Concern was expressed about weed blockage around Papoose Island. The Lake Steward will talk to the Municipality in regard to having that area as a cut for next year.

There was discussion regarding the amount of the municipal tax base that comes from the lake properties. It was suggested that the percentage should be published to make residents of the area aware of the impact of the lake community on our tax base.

The topic of the future of the weed harvester took considerable time. Joe explained that we had a letter from the Municipality wondering if the MLPOA would be interested in owning and operating the harvester. The feeling at the meeting was that without a long-term commitment and a long-term contract from the Municipality as to their position on keeping public areas cut, we would not be interested. Also, it was noted that we do not have the personnel to take on the project alone.

The executive recommended to the membership that we not take on such a task at this time. A motion was moved, seconded and carried unanimously, directing the executive to forward a carefully worded response to the Municipality, indicating our commitment to assist with the harvesting, but giving no further commitment at this time.

Member Bruce McNevin suggested that a press release should be issued and published stating the true facts as to the cost/benefit of the weed harvester program. The consensus was that this should be published in the local paper.

Chair Joe Kaehler noted that we have requested every candidate to send in their position regarding lake policy and have it posted in our website. He stressed the importance of the upcoming Municipal election and the importance of every property owner making sure they are registered to vote. By having your roll number, you can go to vote.ca and find out your status.

Meeting adjourned at 12:10 on a motion from Jim Bakker and Jim Beatty.

Notes:

Note 1 - The Centre Hastings Road Gravel Matching Program is subject to approval in the Municipal budget process. The MLPOA handles administration of the funds, in and out.

Note 2 – The MLPOA has a term deposit of \$5,000 which matures June 28, 2015. Full proceeds will be deposited to the MLPOA general account to ensure adequate funds are available to cover the 911 Lakefront Signs Subsidy. The Subsidy amount cannot be determined until after August 31st when the Subsidy offer expires. Funds not required for ongoing operations after August 31st, 2015 will be invested as to be decided during the subsequent MLPOA Board meeting.

Lake Steward Report – Chuck Noble

Ice Fishing Derby - The 6th Annual Moira Lake Ice Fishing Derby was held on the Family Day weekend in February and was a huge success. This event, once again coordinated by Brad McNevin and Tadum Neuman, raised over of \$5,000 to be donated to O'Hara Mill and the Emily Trudeau Splash Pad. Water Levels and Warnings - Quinte Conservation Authority is reporting both the Flood and Water Levels normal for this time of year.



They are also reporting the water flow rates for the Moira River at both the inlet and outlet of the Lake are either steady or decreasing and near the historical means for this time of year.

Water Condition & Testing – Testing in the Lake is conducted by several government and quasi-government bodies throughout the year. Early in the spring and late in the fall the municipal sewage lagoons are discharged into Deer Creek and through the Lake. This activity is closely monitored, and the test results show that the levels of contaminants in the discharge are very low and much below the permitted safe levels. Nevertheless, the MLPOA continues to voice concerns that the nutrient value (nitrogen, phosphorous, etc.) in the discharge does promote weed growth in the Lake. The Ministry of Health and Quinte Conservation Authority also test the water in the Lake at several sites, including the public beach, throughout the summer months to ensure that the water quality is suitable for swimming, etc. If it reaches what is considered an unsafe level for swimming as did happen once last summer, it will be posted at the Kiwanis Beach (boat launch) as well as on our MLPOA web site. The one posting that did occur last summer was the first posting since 2008, and when I contacted the Ministry I was told it was nothing to be overly alarmed about. They considered our Lake to be a "clean lake" and this was just a one-off occurrence which they believe was due to 3 or 4 days of excessively heavy rain followed by several days of extremely hot temperatures.

Buoys – Our thanks to Don Berry who procured and installed some new buoys on Lower Lake. . Boaters are once again reminded that buoys are placed on a "**best-efforts**" basis by the MLPOA as a guide to known hazards. However, it is the responsibility of boaters to be aware that there may be unmarked rocks or shoals in the Lake, and to govern themselves accordingly.

If you are aware of areas that you feel should be marked but aren't, please advise me or any other Board member, and we will do our best to have this resolved.

Fishing Season Reminder – Season opens for Walleye (Pickerel) and Pike starts the 2nd Saturday in May. Walleye regulations include a slot size limit. Walleye legally kept must be between 40 and 50 centimeters (15.7 to 19.7 inches).

Muskie season starts the 1st Saturday in June, and to be kept, they must be greater than 102 cm (40"). Bass season (Largemouth and Smallmouth) starts the 3rd Saturday in June.

REMEMBER - IT IS ILLEGAL TO ATTEMPT TO CATCH FISH FOR WHICH THE SEASON IS CLOSED, EVEN IF YOU ARE PLANNING ON A LIVE RELEASE.

Weed Harvesting - Although delayed close to a week because of a permit problem last year, the Municipality was able to complete all 3 rounds of cuts on time. In total, over 65 private cuts, along with all the Municipality cuts, were completed. The Municipality areas are the River inlet and outlet, Deer Creek inlet, the culvert running under Highway 62 between Upper and Lower Lake, along with the public swimming area at the boat launch. These areas are all cut to help increase water flow though the Lake which, in turn, improves water quality. This program will be offered again in 2015, and all of the necessary permits have been obtained. We are scheduled to start approximately July18. 2015.

For those interested in having their private beach areas harvested, an application form can be found in this Newsletter for your convenience. Please complete all of the information, and follow all instructions with respect to marking your property. A Lakefront sign, which is now available for order (see Items of Interest in the in the Newsletter), would greatly assist in marking your property.

The idea behind the harvesting is to allow people to clear areas for recreational swimming and for getting boats out into deeper water without destroying the natural habitat of the aquatic life. Harvesting of private areas must not exceed 100 square yards (about 30' x 30'). We have heard from those who have had this done in the past that weeds become much easier to control after one or two cuts.

The cost for 2015 is \$95.00 for a single cut, \$175.00 for two cuts, or \$255.00 for three cuts, and needs to be paid in advance. Payment must be made by July 1st. Please make your cheque payable to "The Municipality of Centre Hastings – Weed Harvesting". It is important that you physically identify the property/area you wish harvested, showing your Lane Name and 911 # visible from Lakeside, to allow the harvester operator access to the correct location. This can be accomplished with either a permanent or temporary sign directing the operator to the area you wish harvested. If you have any submerged water intake lines or pumps, please mark their location with a float to avoid having them damaged by the harvester.

911 Lakefront Signage Subsidy for MLPOA Members

A few years ago, the Municipality of Centre Hastings introduced the idea of lake property owners placing 911 signs visible from the lake. As discussed at last year's AGM, doing so has advantages. On a boat, or on the Ice, a 911 call from a tourist or resident allows a pinpoint response from Emergency Services. **The life or home this saves could be yours.** Also, the Weed Harvester can more easily locate the property that requires weed extraction.

We have made arrangements with Impressions and Promotions in Madoc who will produce 5-inch by 24-inch aluminum signs that will display your 911 number and lane. Colours will mimic your current 911 sign. The cost is \$25.00, plus tax. (\$28.25)

As a member of the MLPOA, your Association is offering to subsidise this cost by \$20.00. Member cost is only \$8.25. **This offer is available from now through August 31**st, **2015.**

As for the Gravel Fund-Matching Program, Liaison Eric Sandford advised that he is heading an initiative that will involve a group (including representation from the MLPOA) that will visit all Zone roadways, and develop potential funding options, subject to Council approval. Garbage Bins and Recycling Stations

The recycling stations are for recyclable waste as per directives issued by Quinte Waste Solutions. These directives are included in this Newsletter. They show what to re-cycle and what not to re-cycle.

Many of our members have asked us to again remind lake property owners and their guests that all recycling is to be properly sorted, placed in the blue bins and not left on the ground next to the bins. The garbage bins are for clear bags only, containing household garbage only. The ground around this bins is not to be used as a drop for other types of disposals. Simply stated, if the disposal does not belong in either the recycling or garbage bins, it is to be taken to the landfill site (see below).

We are also reminded that the garbage and re-cycling stations around the Lake are provided by the Municipality as a convenience for those of us who own property on the Lake. Most lakes in Ontario do not enjoy this convenience. We need to ensure these stations are being properly used. Misuse only causes unnecessary time and expense, and we run the risk of losing the stations altogether.

These bins are for the exclusive use by lake property owners and their guests. If you should see someone who should not be using the bins, please record the vehicle license number, the time and date, and report the incident to the Municipality at 613-473-4030.

Landfill Site

The Municipality of Centre Hastings Landfill Site and recycling station is located at 106968 Highway #7, east of the intersection of Highways #7 and #62. Their phone number is 613-473-4581.

The hours of operation are Mondays and Wednesdays from 8:00 AM – 12:00 (Noon); and Saturdays from 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM.

Summary of Centre Hastings Fire By-law 2006-20

During the period from April 1st to October 31st no fire for the burning of grass, rubbish, wood or other combustible material shall be permitted outdoors between the hours of 7:00 am – 7:00 pm, except for the following:

- Fire for cooking or warmth
- A small fire no more than 1x1 meter attended at all times by an adult
- A fire in a metal container covered by a metal mesh ¼ inch in size

Please note:

- Between October 31st and April 1st of any calendar year, persons who permit any fires to burn out
 of control shall be responsible for the cost to extinguish the fires.
- If the need arises for the Fire Department to use the services of the MNR water bombers, all watercraft are to be docked.
- Remember to check all your smoke detectors when you return for the summer.


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Zones and Zone Representatives
